  - University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign
- Engineering Disciplines: Mechanical, Chemical, Electrical, Civil, Environmental, Petroleum, CIS, MIS, IT and Computer Science
- Minimum grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Full time student
- A minimum of 1 membership/leadership in a technical society or extra-curricular activity (eg. SME, Fraternity/Sorority)
- U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident
- Must demonstrate knowledge and interest in Chevron and energy industry
- A minimum of 1 noteworthy achievement/recognition (Dean's List, etc.)
- A minimum of 1 technical/energy related internship
