About the Job:

As an Environmental Manager, you will be responsible for environmental analysis, as well as control or enforcement activities under direct or close supervision. You will perform assignments in one or more of the following areas: permit development and review; environmental inspections and/or enforcement activities; scientific studies; surveys and/or scientific analyses; assistance for grants and technical guidance to regulated facilities; government officials, and the public. You will act as a liaison to the program's constituents (including various industries and environmental consulting firms), and coordinate with interested federal, state, and local agencies.

A Day in the Life:

The essential functions of this role are as follows:

- You will participate in all activities associated with the collection, identification, and data analysis of
 macroinvertebrate samples collected for the assessment of aquatic life use, required by Section 305(b) of
 the Clean Water Act and used by various Office of Water Quality programs. You will be a specialist in the
 Macroinvertebrate Community Program by leading a crew in the field and serving as Chemical Hygiene
 Officer for the Macroinvertebrate Lab and Storage Rooms. This position performs field, laboratory, and
 office duties described in IDEM's Surface Water Quality Monitoring Strategy and participates in all
 macroinvertebrate community program activities.
- As the Macroinvertebrate Community Program Specialist, you will assist with field reconnaissance, conduct inventory, order macroinvertebrate sampling supplies, serve as field crew leader for sampling (duties include scheduling trips, completing chain of custody forms, and laboratory identifications), assist with entry and quality control of data, review data for water quality violations, and help produce aquatic life use assessments to update the Integrated Report submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.
- As Chemical Hygiene Officer for the Macroinvertebrate Lab and Storage Rooms, you will perform monthly
 safety inspections, coordinate disposal of hazardous chemical waste and annual maintenance/inspection of
 ventilation system, conduct annual safety training on macroinvertebrate lab equipment/supplies and
 procedures, help with annual inspection/inventory of spill kits, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), and
 first aid kit supplies (ordering as necessary), maintain/update Material Safety Data Sheets (SDS's), attend
 Safety Committee Meetings, and respond to emergency spills/leaks in lab and storage rooms as necessary.
- Serve as a resource person for IDEM staff and the public as an environmental scientist and water quality specialist generally familiar with other IDEM programs as well as a specialist in macroinvertebrate community sampling and analysis. You will also assist with other sampling projects as time allows.
