William M. Lapenta NOAA Internship Program

Application period: October 1 - January 5



Includes:

- 10 week internship June-Aug.
- Full time 40 hours per week
- Internship stipend (\$6,000)
- Furnished housing
- Travel allowance to and from host site



Eligibility:

- Enrolled sophomore or junior undergraduate or graduate student
- U.S. citizen
- STEM majors or major related to NOAA's mission

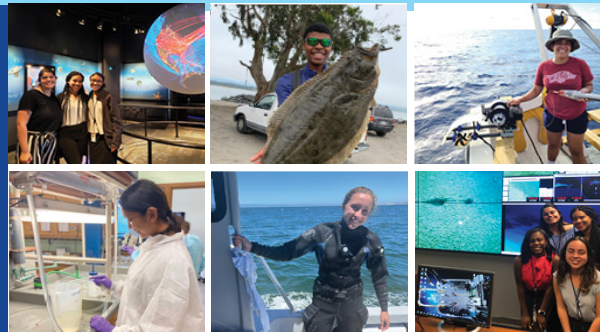
Educational Partnership Program with Minority Serving Institutions (EPP/MSI) Undergraduate Scholarship

Application period: October 1 - January 31



Includes:

- Up to \$45,000 stipend
- Two 10-week paid internships at NOAA
- Support for travel and conference participation



Eligibility:

- Attend an MSI
- U.S. citizen or U.S. national
- 3.2 minimum GPA
- Major in NOAA mission fields, including STEM and social science

Hollings Scholarship Program

Application period: October 1 - January 31



Includes:

- Up to \$40,000 stipend
- One 10-week paid internship at NOAA
- Support for travel and conference participation



Eligibility:

- U.S. citizen attending U.S. institutions
- 3.0 minimum GPA
- Major in NOAA mission fields, including STEM and social science

Woods Hole Partnership Education Program (PEP)

Application period: Open until February 10



Includes:

- Four-credit course
- 10 week research internship (June - Aug) and 5-day ocean research cruise
- Internship stipend
- Furnished housing, travel support



Eligibility:

College students, with priority given to rising juniors and seniors, majoring in the natural sciences, engineering, mathematics or social sciences, who've had course work in oceanography, biology, or marine or environmental science.

African Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, Alaska Natives, and Pacific Islanders, persons with disabilities, veterans, first-generation college students, and economically disadvantaged students strongly encouraged to apply to all NOAA student opportunities
