# **Family Capacity-Building Practices**

In our EITP Fall 2019 Newsletter, we provided an overview of the Division for Early Childhood Recommended Practices (DEC RPs). Because engaging families in early intervention (EI) services is critical for success, we are continuing our focus on the Family practices within the DEC RPs by spotlighting practices that support **family capacity-building**.

Family capacity-building practices involve the participatory opportunities and experiences we give to families that strengthen their existing knowledge and skills and promote the development of new abilities that enhance parenting self-efficacy beliefs and practices.

# What are the Practices that support Family Capacity-Building?

**F5**. Practitioners support family functioning, promote family confidence and competence, and strengthen family-child relationships by acting in ways that recognize and build on family strengths and capacities.

**F6.** Practitioners engage the family in opportunities that support and strengthen parenting knowledge and skills and parenting competence and confidence in ways that are flexible, individualized, and tailored to the family's preferences.

*Tip:* After review the above examples or additional examples of DEC RPs, reflect on your own practices. Individually or collaboratively with a family or team member, consider what you do well and what could be improved.

# **Documentation Tip Sheet**

Complete and accurate documentation provides a comprehensive picture of all the services provided on behalf of a child and family. This includes direct services, IFSP development activities, and other tasks such as leaving messages, emails, faxing documents, etc.

Therefore, EITP has developed a new one-page **Documentation Tip Sheet (pdf)** to help providers with Documentation in the Illinois Early Intervention System! The tip sheet includes rules, reminders and tips in a colorful format that puts everything in one place! # **DEC Communities of Practice**

**DEC Communities of Practice (CoP)** are communities of professionals and families created within and by DEC members and non-members. Communities of Practice are formed to foster connections, further knowledge, and engage in conversations and activities around a common interest.

**Early Intervention**: The Early Intervention CoP is a place where your voice can be heard and where you can gain new insights about working with families of infants and toddlers (birth to age 3) with developmental delays or disabilities. This is the place to pose questions, share ideas, problem solve, and discuss any early intervention topics of interest to you. You can also find resources specific to your interests and enhance your work in early intervention.

**Service Coordination**: The Service Coordination Community of Practice (SC CoP) was created to recognize the value of service coordinators and give these important early intervention team members a professional home. The SC CoP offers service coordinators the opportunities to network with others across the nation, share SC-related resources and tips, and learn about topics relevant to providing high quality service coordination.

**Leadership**: The DEC Leadership Community of Practice is open to any DEC member who shares an interest in leadership as a concept or a practice and wants to affiliate with others to develop leadership capacity in themselves and in the field of early childhood special education. Members come together in several ways, including face-to-face meetings at the DEC Conference and through digital means to build and manage the knowledge they need.

**Protection and Well-Being**: This CoP will provide guidance to the early childhood special education field regarding ways to 1. Prevent and reduce instances of maltreatment among young children with disabilities; 2. Intervene and support young children with disabilities who have experienced maltreatment; 3. Carry out the long- and short-term goals of the DEC position statement.

**Child Outcome Summary Process Resource Package** Developed by EITP for the SSIP LTs, the Child Outcome Summary Process Resource Package is available on our CFC Page to further support early intervention professionals' knowledge and utilization of the federally mandated Child Outcomes Summary (COS) process. This tool was developed and adapted from the Child Outcomes Summary – Team Collaboration (COS-TC) Toolkit. Additionally, many resources from the Early Childhood Technical Assistance Center (ECTA) and The Center for IDEA Early Childhood Data Systems (DaSy) Center are included in this package.

The activities are divided into the following five sections:

- Section 1 Planning for the COS Process
- Section 2 Planning & Explaining the COS Process to Families
- Section 3 Understanding Child Functioning
- Section 4 Building Consensus for High Quality COS Ratings
- Section 5 Interactive Practices

The overall intentions of this resource package, in its entirety, is to 1) support professionals' understanding of the COS process, 2) strengthen professionals' capacities and confidence with reaching accurate and

reliable COS ratings, and 3) highlight practices to promote collaboration and involvement of all team members involved in the COS process.

# State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) Second Quarter Update

As the implementation phase continues, we are excited by the positive changes occurring. Our primary focus is now on our family engagement improvement strategy. Leadership teams continue to plan and support professional development offerings in their area based on local needs. We have

begun our work on the development and refinement of a practice fidelity tool. We have collected input from a variety of stakeholders and will be working with a national technical assistance center to consolidate and use this information. We are continuing to refine the evaluation plan in hopes of including more intermediate measures that demonstrate our progress. We also know that our next submission will need to include our plans for scale up and sustainability, so those discussions are also underway. It's an exciting time to be in early intervention!
