News and Updates

Lead Poisoning Diagnosis Added to El Medical Conditions List

IDHS provides a list of medical conditions that result in a high probability of developmental delay and therefore are "Eligible El Diagnoses." This list also includes information related to whether or not the medical condition is an eligible diagnosis for the <u>Division of Specialized Care for Children</u> (DSCC).

In August 2020, the list <u>Early Intervention Medical Conditions Resulting in High</u> <u>Probability of Developmental Delay and DSCC Screening Information</u> was updated to **now include a Lead Poisoning diagnosis of elevated blood lead levels of 5 micrograms per deciliter.**



It is officially within the <u>89 Illinois Administrative Code</u>, <u>Part 500</u>. For more information on eligibility please visit the <u>EITP Evaluation/Assessment and Eligibility</u> page.

Revised Parent Guide

The parent guide, <u>Educational Rights and Responsibilities: Understanding</u> <u>Special Education in Illinois</u>, has been revised by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) Special Education Department to incorporate the changes in regulation and law that have occurred since its original release in 2009.

<u>Groups (RPGs)</u> throughout the state of Illinois to provide reflective practice opportunities for multidisciplinary professionals working with infants, young children and their families.

RPGs allow early interventionists to strengthen reflective skills and build a deeper understanding of early childhood mental health. Participants meet for a series of 10 monthly two-hour sessions and are able to acquire up to 12 hours of reflective supervision hours that can be applied to the ILAIMH Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health credential application process and El credential hours.

Service Coordinator Corner

The role of the Service Coordinator is critical in EI. There are many Illinois and national initiatives underway. Here are updates and resources related to your work:

Illinois Service Coordination Initiatives

- Statewide and Regional Activities EITP continues to participate in monthly Regional CFC Support
 Meetings to collaborate on interests, priorities, and needs of service coordinators, providers, and families
 within each region. Examples of regional activities that have emerged from these meetings include provider
 meetings across some regions and joint development and sharing of resources/tools.
- <u>IL SC Stakeholder Summary Report</u> In 2019 a survey was conducted to better understand the knowledge and skills stakeholders in Illinois felt were necessary for service coordinators to possess.
 Information was also gathered to learn about service coordinator professional growth and satisfaction and this summary includes the findings and trends identified.
- <u>IL SC Forum</u> Special thanks to Megan Mack, Alanda Lockhart, Lovice Brinkman for co-leading an interactive discussion during our August 2020 meeting. Service coordinators, and those who prepare/support them at the local level, are welcome to join our community.





National SC Initiatives

- Knowledge & Skills for Service Coordinators (KSSC) have officially been taken out of "DRAFT Recommendations" and are finalized! Over 1000 respondents from 42 states responded to the nationwide survey and most are in agreement with the KSSC. In fact, 89% of service coordinators, administrators and other stakeholders who responded to the survey found them to be comprehensive and complete. - Division for Early Childhood (DEC) and Infant Toddler Coordinator Association (ITCA) Joint Service Coordination Position Statement is anticipated to be finalized in September 2020 and released shortly thereafter with the KSSC embedded in the position statement. State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) Update

Throughout these uncertain times, we continue to hear about positive changes occurring in our pilot areas. The focus continues to be on family engagement, and the pandemic has presented increased opportunities for coaching and family togetherness at a level not often experienced before. The support being provided by the leadership teams has been critical as stakeholders navigate uncharted territory. Teams have been offering support opportunities via technology to their provider communities to ensure that they have accurate information and know where to turn for answers.

We have continued to refine a practice fidelity tool with our national technical assistance partners. We are still awaiting the Office of Special Education Program's feedback on the plan we submitted in April. We have contributed to public comment on the proposed reporting requirement changes for the SSIP and are waiting to see how that influences what the final requirements will be. We will be reconvening our large stakeholder group when we know more. We continue to benefit from stakeholder input so if you have any comments, please <u>email Chelsea</u> <u>Guillen</u>.
