### **New Part C Coordinator Announced!**

As of August 1, 2012, Amy Tarr has been designated as the Part C (Early Intervention) Coordinator for the state of Illinois. Amy's former position was as Deputy General Counsel with the Department and was responsible for providing legal guidance to many Department programs, including the Early Intervention Program. She has been with the Department since 2000. Amy has alreaady visited with many CFCs, providers and families across Illinois. We are all delighted to welcome her to this exciting new role!

### Family Assessment and Routines Based Interview Training rolls out statewide!

The recent revisions to Illinois' policies and procedures that took place July 1, 2012 included the beginning of a new family assessment process which includes service coordinators using a Routines Based Interview with all families entering the Illinois EI System. A full day training for all service coordinators took place over a three week period in September and early October at 11 locations with over 500 CFC staff in attendance. The rationale for incorporating family assessment into the intake process, and the impact these have on families was be discussed. Video examples and interactive activities were used to highlight strategies for making the family assessment process a useful and engaging time with families. We are moving forward with an online version of this training for providers which should be up on our website,<u>www.illinoisietraining.org.</u>later this fall. Below is a brief 8 minute video from Dr. Robin McWilliam, creator of the Routines Based Interview, explaining the impact this new process can have on the families we work with.

### Nurturing Environments Highlighted in New Report



A National Science Foundationbacked report in the journal Science argues that children's natural learning style already reflects the scientific process educators will spend the next decade trying to instill in school-age students-if they can get an engaging environment to explore. The report emphasizes that ensuring each child has a nurturing environment to explore early on may be as or more important to getting them ready for school than ensuring they meet pre-literacy benchmarks. In order to be considered a "Business Associate" as covered by HIPAA, providers will need to have a signed Business Associate Agreement (BAA) with each E-Fax provider utilized. All of the above referenced providers offer BAAs. Providers choosing to utilize an E-Fax provider are responsible for establishing an account with the vendor and ensuring all proper agreements are in place prior to use. The criteria used in evaluating the above vendors includes:

- not utilizing third party vendors to store and transmit data,
- executable BAAs,
- domestic data storage within the United States, and
- guaranteed HIPAA secure accounts for customers with BAAs.
